MEALS ON WHEELS

153, 589 Total meals delivered.

2,210 Blizzard boxes with 10,700 nonperishable meals were distributed. In partnership with Helping Harvest Food Bank, more than 16,250 bags of fresh fruits and vegetables were given to Meals on Wheels clients in 2022.

- 707 clients per day.
- 1,249 unique clients served.
- 370 new in 2022.
- 180 change of condition situations reported by volunteers were addressed.

PA MEDI COUNSELING

Trained counselors helped 1,455 Medicare clients review their policies, enroll in services, and assist with resolving billing problems. More than 2,800 calls were received with Medicare questions.

- Savings of more than \$294,650.
- 34 Medicare presentations were conducted in-person/online in English and Spanish.
- 1154 rent and property tax rebates.
- 360 produce checks distributed.





BERKS ENCORE CARE+

Our Care Managers provide support to clients and their family members with planning and taking action that ensures quality care for an optimal life. 28 clients served. In addition, East Penn, R.M. Palmer and RACC offer BE Care+ as part of their employee assistance program.

BENOURISHED

In partnership with Penn State Health St. Joseph and Redner's Markets, we provide medically tailored meals to referred clients with a cardiac or diabetic diagnosis. 30 clients served.

HEALTH & WELLNESS

Our licensed instructors offered: 51 total programs to 588 participants.

61% of the participants were new.

- 36 Evidence-based programs focused on improving strength, flexibility and balance.
- 394 participants, 236 were new to our classes.
- 15 Other health & wellness classes.
- 194 Other program participants, 102 were new.





WELLNESS & ACTIVITY CENTERS

Our six Wellness & Activity Centers are located throughout Berks County in Douglassville, Fleetwood, Reading, Shillington, Strausstown, and Wernersville.

- More than 1200 unique patrons participated in center activities.
- 7 virtual exercise classes were offered weekly.
- 34 exercise classes with 838 participants.
- 29,212 lunch meals were served to 706 unique center patrons.

FRIENDLY VISITOR

Through Berks Encore's Friendly Visitors Program, we connect homebound seniors with adult volunteers who agree to call or visit for about one hour per week.

25 volunteers and 15 clients participated.

GROCERY SHOPPING

Our volunteers grocery shop for clients who are unable to go to the store and shop for themselves. 63 volunteers assisted 95 clients with over 2,500 grocery orders.





VOLUNTEERS

Our 732 dedicated volunteers make it possible for us to offer our many programs. More than 54,000 volunteer hours were completed. The estimated value of a volunteer's time is \$29.95/hour, providing a value of \$1.6 million. We had 131 new volunteers this year.

BERKS ENCORE is a nonprofit leader of senior services in Berks County. The services provided by Berks Encore offer support for our community's older adults without compromising their independence. Through advocacy, education and referrals, we develop aging-confident individuals to enhance their ability to live well later in life.
